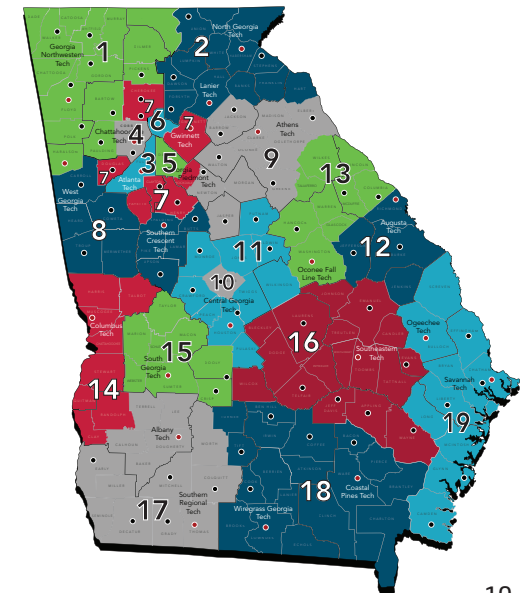
WorkSource Georgia provides Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) funds and technical assistance to 19 workforce development areas across the state. WIOA funds target training opportunities in high-demand fields, which ensures that participants leave the program with a living wage in a growth industry.

### WIOA FUNDS IMPACT:

- **84%** of adult participants gained employment.
- **89%** of dislocated workers gained employment.
- **77%** of youth participants gained employment or were placed in education programs.
